
The AWARE mission team is from Belmont UMC in Nashville. They usually come every year and this time 3 young adults participated. We pray they will bring other young adults next year.

This year the major project the team worked on was a thermal house: A strong


metal structure and walls made of clay and chopped up grass of some kind. The

Missionary Miguel Mairena is sharing a Biblical reflection about how women in the Bible helped Jesus.


